HOME GROWN follows the Dervaes family who run a small organic farm in the heart of urban Pasadena, California. While "living off the grid", they harvest over 6,000 pounds of produce on less than a quarter of an acre, make their own bio diesel, power their computers with the help of solar panels, and maintain a website that gets 4,000 hits a day. Filmmaker Robert McFalls will be present to talk about the Dervaes family and the process of making the film.

An evening devoted to bees.

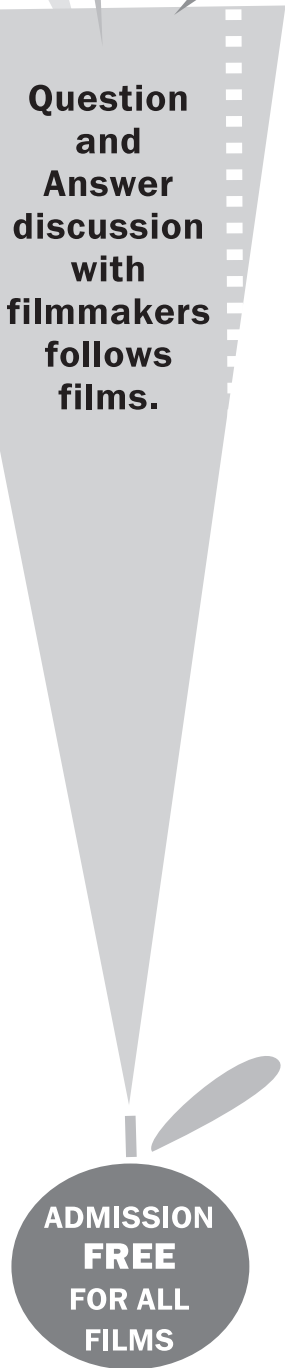
The film unfolds as a dramatic tale of science and mystery illuminating the crisis called Colony Collapse Disorder and looks at the greater meaning about the relationship between humankind and mother earth. Filmmakers Maryam Henein and George Langworthy will present their work-in-progress, RETURN OF THE HONEYBEE, and lead a discussion about the current state of bees.

FOOD, INC.

Wrapping up the series is FOOD, INC., Robert Kenner's documentary look at the industrial food system. Featuring Fast Food Nation's Eric Schlosser, journalist Michael Pollan, and Joel Salatin, one of the country's best-known integrated sustainable farmers, Food, Inc. is a filmic continuation of the investigation begun in last year's *King Corn* - a look at how subsidized corn has "cornered" the food system, with particular emphasis on Monsanto Corp. Robert Kenner will do Q&A after the screening.
